All about treatment options

Medical management is the cornerstone of movement disorder care. Treatment with medications — including pills and/or botulinum toxin (Botox®) injections — is combined with patient education and family support as part of the comprehensive therapy plan we provide for all our patients.

Because movement disorders are often accompanied by behavioral, cognitive and other “non-motor” complications, our diverse team of experts also can assist with issues like depression, cognitive decline and nutrition as well as advise you on disease prognosis.



Team members collaborate on each patient's unique needs so that individualized treatment plans can be developed. For some patients, medical management can be complemented by the latest innovations in functional and restorative neurosurgery, including:

- Deep brain stimulation
- MRI-guided focused ultrasound
- Gamma Knife® radiosurgery
- Spinal cord stimulation
- Shunt procedures
